The scene is surreal, a misty morning at Rush Ranch, in the hours before the sun has burned off the fog. Rushing out of the mist are three magnificent forms, dark with serpentine necks. First impression is that these are the mythical creatures of the Lochs arising from the marsh. As they approach, the vision is not of sea creatures, but of the new arrivals at the ranch, Apollo, Mercury and Joaquim, Friesian horses of great beauty, style and presence. The stallion, Apollo, is returning home after training with the renowned Olympic dressage rider and trainer, Willy Arts, and will begin his breeding career in California, while continuing his driving training. Our ultimate goal is to reach the World Equestrian Games in Kentucky in 2010. Apollo's companions are two imported Dutch Friesian geldings donated by Pietje van Exel. Pietje's late husband, Adam, was the force behind the famous van Exel Belgian hitch of the 1990's.

ANYWHERE WILD!

Anywhere Wild!, makes wild places accessible to people with disabilities in a new way by inviting campers with mobility issues to join us. The Wildflower Wingding at Ft. Hunter Liggett/Los Padres Forest will be held April 1-5th. Horses and carriages will arrive late afternoon on the 1st, and our first meal will be served that evening. Saturday the 4th we will be providing rides at the San Antonio de Padua Mission for the local visitors. After breakfast on Sunday we will head home. This venue offers both camping, and lodging at the historic Hacienda designed by Julia Morgan.

We invite you to join us and experience the beauty of the wildflowers as we drive through Fort Hunter Liggett and the Los Padres Forest, once the vast estate of William Randolph Hearst. We will explore the beautiful oak woodlands beneath towering rock formations and enjoy seeing Old California at its best. To defray our costs, we will be asking campers to pay a reasonable fee, with "scholarships" available. All meals will be provided, electricity is readily available and the facilities are wheelchair accessible. HIPPOTHERAPY

A committee has been formed to investigate and develop a program of Hippotherapy to be offered to veterans who have returned from the wars suffering from Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and others with neurological problems who can benefit from this unique therapy.

Hippotherapy sessions are provided by a licensed Physical Therapist, and utilize the movement of the horse to achieve functional outcomes. The three dimensional movement of the horse affects normalization of muscle tone, postural strength and head control, overall strength of the upper and lower extremities, range of motion, balance, coordination, motor skills, sensory integration, etc. Riding skills are not a focus. Functional outcomes that are applicable to the improvement of a patient's life are the focus.

Access Adventure is uniquely suited for this program, as we are already committed to serving the needs of people with disabilities, of all types.
